2. Get the community involved

Invite local fire and police departments to participate by inspecting child safety seats, informing attendees about garage theft prevention, etc.

3. Offer Garage Door Safety Month specials

- Offer price discounts on preventative maintenance calls.
- Give away a free car emergency or first-aid kit.
- 4. Distribute invitation flyers in local neighborhoods, schools, and community centers

5. Gain local media attention

- Send a press release to local newspapers about garage door safety.
- Contact local TV and radio stations; let them know that you are a local expert.

Connect with the commercial audience

Consider a safety fair focused on commercial business by inviting owners, facility managers, and general contractors to learn about dock and door safety.

- Consider hosting a "Lunch and Learn" or "Bagels and Brew" event.
- Offer a discount on fire door drop testing or preventative maintenance contracts.
- Demonstrate how to check safety reversing features on motorized doors.
- Provide training on how to identify signs of wear and tear that may impact proper door operation and functionality.

Highlight key product features

Garage Door Safety Month also provides an ideal opening to educate homeowners about important garage door opener features. For example, if you live and/or work in areas prone to power outages, potential wildfires, or other natural disasters, this would be an excellent opportunity to talk about operator options available in these situations.

Inform homeowners that there are many operators on the market that feature battery backups. In case of a power outage, a door operator equipped with a battery backup offers a convenient method of opening the garage door. Keep in mind that the battery backup should be tested periodically to make sure that it supplies adequate power to open a closed door to its fully open position and will

require replacement after two to five years depending on usage and type.

Additional instructions about battery backup replacements and how to open a garage door manually if the operator fails can be found on DASMA Technical Data Sheet 385. Refer to this essential resource tool to educate homeowners in your community.
